In the 1st Adabashev pair (threat and variation 1...Sh3), Theme Pseudo-Le Grand at 2nd move (Mates B and C which are the 2nd moves of the 2nd Adabashev pair). In the 2nd Adabashev pair (variations 1...b:c5 and 1...W:c5), 2.distant blockings of the same flight (with arrival correction) followed by 2.Pawn-batteries echoed mates (which are the 2nd moves of the 1st Adabashev pair) 4-fold cycle of 2nd and 3rd white moves (AC-CD-DB-BA). Double exchange of 2nd and 3rd white moves (AB/BA and DC/CD). The by-play variation Se6 x is structural, because this move is at same time mandatory to prevent the threat 2.d:e5 at 2nd move (2...Se6!), and then becomes a natural defence at 1st move against the threat 2.d:c6; it is a bonus that this by-variation allows to show again a quiet move by Pawn at 2nd move, with changed white moves. [A].

Pairs connected by W1/W2 move exchange (I - III and II - IV), mutual interferences between Black Queen and White Bishop (I - III) and Rook (II - IV), Exchange of functions (guard + interference/mate) between white Knight and White Bishop (I - III) and Rook (II - IV).
